LEARNING AND STUDENTS

Inclusive Education

INRTU has created the conditions necessary for successful education of students with disabilities. The organization of inclusive education at INRTU includes: creating adaptive-type training programs; creating a barrier-free environment; organizing a system of tutoring, psychological, pedagogical and medical support; organizing the technological capability of electronic and distance learning.

Package policy for students in need

Our university offered various scholarship programs and other forms of financial support for students who have taken an academic leave of absence for medical reasons. They may receive a monthly compensation payment. Moreover, the university offers discounts as well as study at the expense of the university for the persons in a difficult life situation and representatives of socially disadvantaged groups of population.

Study Programs

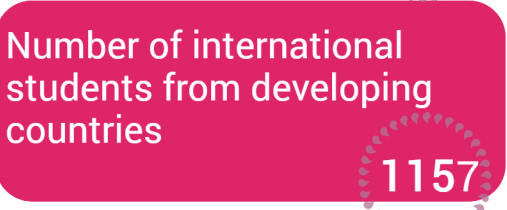
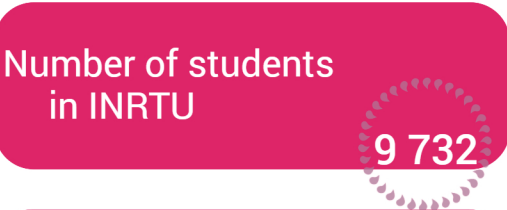
INRTU, despite its technical orientation, has a postgraduate program in Sociology, one of the objectives of which is the study of inequality and tolerance in society. Undergraduate students in the humanitarian fields, such as Management, Journalism, and Economics, have social development and inclusive education as part of their curricula.



RESEARCH

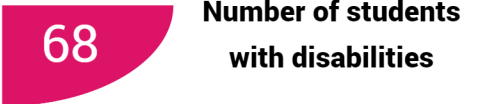
The DAAD Lectorate at INRTU

The university is involved in the initiatives of the German Academic Exchange Service DAAD in terms of which a DAAD professor teaches German language to INRTU students absolutely free of charge. Thanks to this, low-income students have the opportunity to receive scholarship support and study as part of international academic exchange.



Annual equal admission

The university annually provides government-funded places for degree programs for applicants who have special rights and keeps a record of them. So in 2021 INRTU granted 169 places for the bachelor's degree programs for candidates with special rights. As a result of the admission campaign, 21 students with disabilities and 55 students from orphans without parental care were enrolled with full financial support. It is also important for INRTU to promote equal admission rights for women. A total of 1,254 women were admitted in 2021.



Business Accelerator for Research Purposes

For students from low-income countries, the university provides tuition discounts of up to 80% and reduced fees for undergraduate, graduate, and postgraduate programs in English and Russian. In 2021, the annual international festival of intellectual competitions "Future Leaders of Eurasia" was held, where the main prizes were 12 grants to study in undergraduate programs in English.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

INRTU Cooperation

INRTU and the Scientific Center for Family Health and Human Reproduction have begun to develop cooperation in three areas: robotics, biotechnology, and sports medicine. Students will be engaged in research as part of project-based learning. An agreement was signed on joint patenting under the Eurasian Patent Office of a rehabilitation simulator for patients with cerebral palsy. At the request of doctors, INRTU professor developed a robotic complex for the rehabilitation of children with motor disorders..

Abilympics

INRTU students took part in the regional Abilympics championship. The students competed in the competencies "Word Processing" and "Master of Digital Information Processing". Abilympics is an international noncommercial movement that aims to develop the system of professional skill competitions for people with disabilities and disabilities in the Russian Federation.



OPERATIONS



Admission Non-Discrimination Policy

The university has a special non-discrimination policy for people with disabilities, orphans, and children with no parental care. The university carries out the following work with students with disabilities: - conducting career guidance; - creation of special conditions for admission to study, such as providing technical means if necessary, an assistant to fill out applications for admission and other documents; - creating special conditions for conducting entrance examinations, as well as for filing and considering appeals; to take the university entrance exams in the absence of the results of the unified state exam.

INRTU Students Trade Union

The university has departments that are involved in implementing the policy of multiculturalism and non-discrimination: the department for additional education and social work and the student trade union committee, whose tasks include organizing social work in the interests of students and employees of INRTU, creating the necessary conditions to meet the needs of the individual in intellectual, cultural, moral and aesthetic and physical development, developing regulations for the provision of material support to students and employees in need and the assistance of low income.
