LEARNING AND STUDENTS

Study programs

INRTU offers its students the following programs: Jurisprudence (civil law profile and criminal law profile) and also National Security Legal Support (state-legal profile). These study programs include compulsory competencies which are included in self-set educational standards of higher education (Bachelor's and Specialist's degrees). Such competencies are ability to apply the foundations of legal knowledge in various fields and ability to shape intolerance to corruption.

The acquisition of skills

INRTU implements clinical legal education based on a legal clinic, which was established by the university. At the clinic, law students provide legal assistance to socially vulnerable individuals free of charge under supervision and guidance of teachers-curators and they also provide legal protection of public interest. Legal clinic internship is included in curriculum of law students.

INRTU holds an annual All-Russian scientific-practical conference of young scientists 'Constitutionalism and Power in Russia: History, Contemporary Problems and Perspectives'. Students annually have meetings with law enforcement officials and master classes.



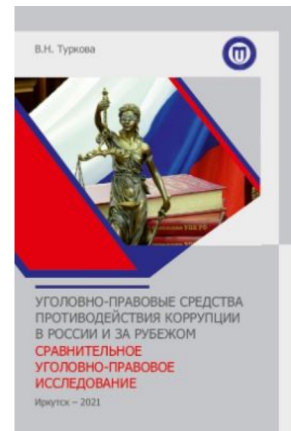
RESEARCH

Olympiads and conferences

Department of the Theory of Law, Constitutional and Administrative Law organized several conferences and competitions, such as regional conference 'Security of Individual, State and Society: Challenges, Problems and Perspectives', Olympiad on Constitutional Law, Olympiad on Legal Studies for non-law students, Olympiad on Theory and history of state and law. In general, 156 participants were registered at competitions and 36 participants were registered at regional conference 'Security of Individual, State and Society: Challenges, Problems and Perspectives'. Jurisprudence and National Security Legal Support students take part in scientific conferences and competitions.

Scientific publishing

Teaching staff is constantly engaged in scientific activities. In 2021, associate professor of INRTU, Mikhail Mushinskiy published a training manual 'Counteracting corruption'. Senior Lecturer, Valentina Turkova published a monograph 'Criminal measures as reaction to corruption in Russia and abroad: comparative law research'.



PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

Eliminating financial illiteracy

A unique educational event was organized by a fourth-year student, Pavel Shiharbeev. He performed as a speaker with a lecture on the elimination of financial illiteracy and reduction of illicit arms flows.

Such event took place within the framework of the project 'INRTU Lecture Hall'.



International festival

INRTU is an organizer of the festival 'Siberia - is a territory of peace and accord'. The event is devoted to the national cultures and it is aimed at involving students from developing countries in solving global problems.



OPERATIONS

Financial benefits

The university makes payments such as incentive allowances and additional benefits to the university staff, based on an effective contracts system of scientific and pedagogical staff. One of the main tasks of this system is the formation of an effective system of material and moral stimulation of the university staff.

Scholarships

Outstanding students, who study on a budget basis, have an opportunity to receive an increased ranking scholarship. Another opportunity is given to the students studying on a commercial basis. They can receive the academic scholarship for their achievements in various fields.

Ideal place for making a project

Tochka Kipeniia is a co-working center of INRTU existing for educational and project activities of students and staff. The co-working center makes possible to implement modern formats of extracurricular work to develop professional competencies. Additionally, co-working center helps students to avoid the feeling of isolation, while working at home alone and eliminate distractions.
